



# PIAA Sports Physicals Required for All Athletes in Grades 7-12

If students are receiving physicals from their primary care physician or at an urgent care, physicals must be the PIAA form and <u>completed after</u> <u>May 1st.</u> School physical forms <u>ARE NOT</u> the same as the PIAA physical form. <u>Valid PIAA physicals</u> <u>must be completed and turned in to</u> <u>Miss Virginia to participate in a</u> <u>sport.</u>
